

## Noeline Clark Foundation University of Canterbury Scholarship

Noeline Clark, a former Divisional Principal of Burnside High School from 1960 to 1976, established a charitable trust for the benefit of students of the school in providing a financial assistance towards the study of an undergraduate programme at the University of Canterbury.

Each scholarship is intended to pay all tuition fees and/or course-related costs for the first year of study to a maximum value of \$5,000.00. Up to four scholarships are awarded each year.

The scholarships are awarded by the Trustees on the recommendations of a selection committee appointed under the provisions of the Trust Deed. The Selection Committee comprises of a representative of the University of Canterbury nominated by the Vice Chancellor, a woman nominated by the Committee of the Canterbury Branch of the New Zealand Federation of University Women Incorporated and the Principal of Burnside High School.

The selection criteria is determined by the Selection Committee but includes not only academic achievement but character, temperament, involvement in extra-curricular activities and services to Burnside High School. Financial need may also be considered but shall not be the paramount factor.

At present, there is no restriction in the Trust Deed that prevents the award should the recipient be rewarded other awards.

Should the recipient withdraw from undergraduate study at the University of Canterbury then all amounts awarded must be credited in favour of the Noeline Clark Foundation less any fees retained by the University of Canterbury for costs incurred in the enrolment.
